## School waste reduction and recycling grants

Hennepin County provides grants for preschools, K-12 schools, and higher education institutions to start or improve programs to divert recycling and organic materials, which includes food and non-recyclable paper, from the trash. Grant funding can also be used to take steps to reduce waste in the first place.

Eligible recipients	Preschools, K-12 schools, and higher education institutions in Hennepin County
Eligible expenses	<ul> <li>Bins, barrels, carts and sorting stations</li> <li>Reusable foodware to replace disposables</li> <li>Sharing table supplies</li> <li>Bulk condiment dispensers to replace single-use options</li> <li>Reimbursement for monitors to oversee separation of organics, recycling, and trash</li> <li>Stipends for staff to implement and lead the grant project</li> </ul>
Application timeline	The following organizations may apply for the first round of grants: Head Start, two-year colleges, and preschools and K-12 schools with at least 50% of students qualifying for free and reduced lunch Applications for this round are due Thursday, February 27. Applications from any K-12 school, preschool, college, or university in the county will be accepted from March 18 through October 15 or until available funds are depleted.
Amount of funding available	<ul> <li>The minimum award is \$1,000.</li> <li>The maximum award is \$20,000 for qualifying applications who apply by the February 27 deadline.</li> <li>The maximum award is \$15,000 for applications submitted March 18 or later.</li> <li>\$150,000 is available annually.</li> </ul>
Project timeline	Projects must be completed in 2 years.
Reporting requirements	Midterm and final report with progress of project.
Examples of projects	<ul> <li>Priority is given to the following types of projects:</li> <li>Food waste prevention or donation</li> <li>Replacing single-use and disposable items with bulk and reusable items</li> <li>Collection of recyclables in areas outside of the school building and at special events.</li> </ul>
