# Preventing Legionnaires' disease at hotels

### Legionnaires' outbreak at Minnesota Hotel

The Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) is currently <u>investigating an outbreak of Legionnaires' disease</u> associated with an Albert Lea hotel. So far, they have identified two laboratory-confirmed cases among people in unrelated groups. Both have been hospitalized, one has been discharged; one has not. Additional cases are continuing to be investigated.

### What is Legionnaires' disease?

- Legionnaire's disease is caused by the bacteria *Legionella*.
- It is spread by inhaling the fine spray from water sources containing *Legionella* bacteria not person to person.
- It is frequently spread at hotels and resorts through showers, unoccupied floors, fountains, cooling towers and/or hot tubs and spas.
- The time between exposure to the bacteria and the start of symptoms can be up to 14 days.
- It is a bacterial pneumonia that can be severe.
- Symptoms include fever, fatigue, headache, muscle aches, chills, shortness of breath, loss of appetite and coughing.
- Not everyone who is exposed to *Legionella* bacteria develops Legionnaires' disease.

#### How to prevent a Legionnaires' outbreak at your hotel:

- 1. Take this quiz to see if your building needs a water management plan
- Create or update your buildings water management plan using <u>ASHRAE Standard 188: Legionellosis: Risk</u> <u>Management for Building Water Systems (ANSI approved)</u> or the <u>CDC's toolkit on Developing a Water</u> <u>Management Program to Reduce Legionella Growth and Spread in Buildings</u>
- 3. Follow guidance for ensuring water quality after low occupancy
