Tour  Hennepin Energy Recovery Center (HERC) hennepin.us/herc	Hennepin County offers facility tours at the Hennepin County Energy Recovery Center (HERC) waste-to-energy facility.  HERC is a waste-to-energy facility where waste is received and burned to generate steam and electricity. Tours describe how the plant works and fits within the county's solid waste management system to divert waste from landfills.  Participants must be 14 years of age or older.

The tour highlights the importance of reducing, reusing, recycling and preventing waste and pollution.  Participants must be in 2 <sup>nd</sup> Grade or older.
