



## THE COST OF SCHOOL SUPPLIES ADDS UP.

Keep your receipts for tax time savings!

If you have a child in grades K-12, keep documentation from educational expenses to increase your tax refund or lower the tax you owe with the **K-12 Education Credit and Subtraction.**

### How to claim the K-12 Education Credit and Subtraction:

1. **Save** receipts and document expenses. For list of common qualifying expenses, see reverse.
2. **Bring** receipts and documentation when you file taxes.
3. **File** your taxes for free. To locate a free tax preparation site, call United Way 2-1-1 at 1-800-543-7709.

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**COMMON QUALIFYING EXPENSES:**

- School supplies such as pens, pencils, notebooks & calculators
- Purchase or rental of musical instruments
- Academic rental fees
- Textbooks
- Summer school & camp tuition
- Drivers education fees & supplies
- Extra academics & fine arts fees
- Educational field trips
- Required gym clothes
- School bus & city transportation fees to school
- Private school tuition
- Home school supplies
- Computers & software (up to \$200)
- Tutoring fees
- Classroom fees
- Tuition for college courses taken in high school

**NON-QUALIFYING EXPENSES:**

- Clothing & uniforms
- Extra accessories such as backpacks, tissues & locker organizers
- School lunches & snacks
- Non-academic activities, programs & sports
- Monthly Internet bills
- Cost of driving a child or child driving themselves to school
- Supplies normally provided by the school
- ACT & SAT testing fees
