ADULT PROTECTION SERVICES

Services: After a report is made to the MN Adult Abuse Reporting Center, Hennepin County Adult Protection social workers investigate reports of alleged abuse, neglect, and financial exploitation of vulnerable adults who are unable to protect themselves due to physical or mental impairments. Through the provision of protective social services, staff assists people in establishing a network of support to help reduce their risk of further harm. When legal intervention is required to protect a Vulnerable Adult from harm, Adult Protection staff can assist with civil commitment, an order for protection, the removal of a perpetrator, and with the appointment of a guardian or conservator.

ASSERTIVE COMMUNITY TREATMENT (ACT)

Population Served: ACT supports people who have re-experienced symptoms of serious and persistent mental illness, and/or may have co-occurring disorders (e.g., SPMI and substance abuse) when supported with less intensive supports. Histories often include multiple or extended hospitalizations, court-ordered treatment at a Regional Treatment Center, and placements in other restrictive settings. People may also have a significant history of homelessness or contact with the criminal justice system as a direct result of symptoms of their mental illness. Without intensive supportive services, they may be considered at imminent risk of civil commitment or nursing home placement and may be unable to secure or maintain more independent living situations. Initial Contact and Access approves clients for admission.

Services: An interdisciplinary team that includes a psychiatry provides Support services. Caseloads are 1:10. Services include case management, and services that instruct, assist and support the person in skills such as interpersonal communication, community resource utilization and integration, relapse prevention, budgeting and shopping, healthy lifestyle, cooking and nutrition, and transportation. Other support services include medication education and monitoring, mental illness symptom management, crisis assistance, health care directives, and transition to community living services.

CASE MANAGEMENT SERVICES

Hennepin County Front Door (to start a referral): 612-348-4111

Services: Direct work with individuals and care communities in a collaborative enriching and respectful partnership, to identify, secure and sustain a full range of resources, both internal and external, to assist individuals to live in independently in the community. Functional assessments and support plans specifically address mental health symptoms, mental health needs, chemical use/addiction, vocational/education, social, interpersonal, self-care, medical, dental, financial, housing, and transportation needs.

Hennepin County Behavioral Health Case Management Teams

Community Integration and Recovery Teams (CIRT): 612-348-4111

Services: Case management for adults who have been court-ordered to receive treatment through the civil commitment process.

Housing and Relocation Team (HART): 612-348-4111

Services: Intensive case management for persons at Anoka-Metro RTC, and to people under a Rule 20 court order to treat to competency.

Hennepin County Forensic Case Management: 612-348-4111

Services: Social workers provide specialized case management services to people who are indeterminately committed as Mentally Ill and Dangerous. Supervision and support of participation in treatment and rehabilitation programs is tightly structured. When people leave inpatient treatment to re-enter the community, case managers monitor compliance with the conditions of release.

COURT ORDERED COMMITMENT & COMMITMENT ALTERNATIVES

Community Alternative Response Team (CART)

Services: Short-term (under 90 days) intensive services aim to reduce commitments to Anoka-Metro Regional Treatment Center and other RTCs. The team focuses on early intervention services for people referred by Hennepin County Prepetition Screening or the adult crisis team (COPE).

Diversion and Recovery Team (DART)

Services: Case management for adults struggling with severe and chronic substance abuse. The team focus is on providing stable housing and harm reduction. Over time, they seek to see a reduction of hospital and detoxification use.

Services: Mental Health professionals screen individuals who are being considered for commitment because of struggles related to mental illness, chemical dependency, or developmental disabilities. The program attempts to prevent unnecessary petitions and commitments by diverting people to voluntary alternatives whenever possible. The PSP process typically takes place in a hospital setting while the patient is on a 72-hour hold, but people may also be in a community setting. In order to obtain a screening, there must be a "Petitioner" (someone interested in committing a person) and an "Examiner's Statement" (an official statement signed by a Medical Doctor, Ph.D. Psychologist, or advanced practice nurse).

COMMUNITY SUPPORT PROGRAMS

Hennepin County Front Door: 612-348-4111

Services: Community Support Programs (CSPs) provide easy access to a wide spectrum of services, support, and resources for persons with serious and persistent mental illness (SPMI).

Examples: volunteer and work opportunities, daily living skills training, benefits assistance, social/recreational activities, employment assistance, housing support, and referrals for needed services.

The primary goal of CSPs are to assist people in developing the skills necessary to function as independently as possible in the community and to provide an environment that encourages the development of person-centered support systems, including mutual-help networks.

Referrals: CSPs can make referrals to other mental health resources such as outpatient treatment, crisis intervention, case management, and employability services. Program hours vary by provider and sometimes change to meet the needs of their members. Some programs include evening and weekend hours.

CRISIS RESPONSE & INTERVENTION

Community Outreach for Psychiatric Emergencies (COPE): 612-596-1223

Telephone and Mobile Crisis Team Available 24/7

Services: COPE is a multi-disciplinary, mobile crisis response team that serves adults 18+ in Hennepin County. Team members are available 24/7 to provide outreach to people experiencing a mental health crisis. Mobile crisis services include the following: onsite crisis assessments; risk assessments; deescalating a crisis situation; helping with safety planning; referrals to a hospital for further evaluation or placement at a crisis residence; and referrals for COPE stabilization services as appropriate. COPE responds to situations that occur within the geographic boundaries of Hennepin County though residency is not necessary for initial services. Calls are accepted from persons referring themselves, treatment professionals, residential facilities, family members, or any concerned individual. The primary goal of COPE mobile crisis services is to help people to manage their mental health crises in their current setting.

Services: Emergency evaluation and short-term treatment for people in a psychiatric crisis. The center works closely with other professionals, agencies, and community resources. Crisis intervention phone service, immediate help and referral for persons threatening suicide; and walk-in crisis services. The APS provides these services to any person in need. Our treatment team includes psychiatrists, psychologists, psychiatric social workers, advanced nurse practitioners, and psychiatric nurses.

The Crisis Residence is an alternative to hospitalization, a place to go for more care and support after leaving inpatient treatment.

The program assists individuals in resolving the circumstances that brought them to the facility, develops a Crisis Stabilization Plan within 24 hours of admission, and designs a Crisis Prevention Action Plan. Persons admitted stay in the program from one to 10 days. Psychiatric consultants are available to evaluate and prescribe medications if necessary, and medical staff coordinates psychiatric care with existing mental health providers. People seeking assistance must have a Crisis Assessment completed by an authorized health provider prior to admission. All Minnesota State Health Plans and many private health insurance plans cover crisis services. Hennepin County pays for crisis services for eligible uninsured county residents.

Services: Services are provided to people who are deaf, hard of hearing, or deaf/blind, and struggle with a mental illness. The Assisted Living Plus program houses up to 10 individuals. The Penn and Scott Houses provide adult foster care for up to four individuals in each house. The goal is to assist residents to develop the skills necessary to live, work, and socialize in the community. The services provide a safe environment in which residents can practice new skills such as socialization, cooking, money management, and hygiene.

Reentry Program: Supporting second chances, reentry works 1-1 with individuals exiting incarceration to connect them to resources that help stabilize their lives and avoid a return to prison. Enroll at no cost; support stipends may also be available to eligible, referred participants. Receive career navigation, mentoring, advocacy and financial literacy services through 1-1 case management. Connect to mental/chemical wellness services and legal aid partners in the area.

Dislocated Worker Program: Get the support and training you need to land your next job or career with the Dislocated Worker Program. We assist laid off Minnesotans with these services at no cost. Career counseling and assessments to help determine your career path. Funding for career certifications and training programs. Services: RISE, Inc. and Jewish Family Children's Service provide person-centered vocational evaluation, job search and placement assistance with retention support to help individuals reach their full career potential, establish independence and become integrated into the community. Target population consists of Hennepin County residents 18 and older with SPMI who are able to benefit from community-based vocational rehabilitation services. Individuals aged 21-64 with no dependent children, referred by the Hennepin Health Program.

FORENSIC ASSERTIVE COMMUNITY TREATMENT (FACT)

Population Served: FACT supports people who have re-experienced symptoms of serious and persistent mental illness, and/or may have co-occurring disorders (e.g., substance abuse) when supported with less intensive supports, AND are involved with the criminal justice system. Histories often include multiple or extended hospitalizations, court-ordered treatment at a Regional Treatment Center, and placements in other restrictive settings. People may also have a significant history of homelessness as a direct result of symptoms of their mental illness. Without intensive supportive services, they may be considered at imminent risk of civil commitment or nursing home placement and may be unable to secure or maintain more independent living situations. Initial Contact and Access approves clients for admission.

Services: An interdisciplinary team that includes a psychiatrist provides support services. Caseloads are 1:10. Services include case management, and services that instruct, assist and support the person in skills such as interpersonal communication, community resource utilization and integration, relapse prevention, budgeting and shopping, healthy lifestyle, cooking and nutrition, and transportation. Hours: Mon-Fri, 8am - 4:30pm; replies within 2 business days

Services: The Front Door Social Services program consolidates intake for most voluntary programs and connects people to the level of service that best meets their needs. Front Door response ranges from connecting callers to community resources or other providers, providing education and consultation, or providing intake into county-operated programs. A team of Social Workers answers initial requests and Public Health Nurses, who help callers, define their service needs and offers consultation about how those needs can be met. If a caller seems to require additional county assistance, the caller may be connected to another service area that will do a more thorough evaluation of needs and will assess client eligibility for possible ongoing services from the county or a contracted provider.

INTENSIVE RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT SERVICES (IRTS)

Intensive residential treatment services (IRTS) are time-limited mental health services provided by 24-hour mental health staff in a residential setting, for those in need of 24-hour structure and assistance. In the 90day stay, the individual is provided personalized support guiding their discovery of what is important to them; how best they receive support; the way they communicate and make decisions; and how to move to outcomes and actions that leads to greater community integration.

Services: Individualized assessment and treatment planning, crisis assistance, crisis prevention plans, illness management and recovery, nursing, family education, transition and discharge planning, living skills development including medication self-administration, healthy living, household management, cooking and nutrition, budgeting and shopping, using transportation, and vocational skills.

SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER

Services: Substance use services are available to Hennepin County residents who have problems with drug or alcohol abuse and meet income guidelines, or who have been referred by the court. Services are available directly from a variety of health care and social services providers. Most programs are culturally diverse and offer different treatment models. Services include substance use assessments, Detoxification, Referrals to Rule 31 chemical dependency treatment programs for high, medium, and low-intensity inpatient and outpatient treatment services, supportive housing, and case management, other support services. Private insurance may not cover all or some substance use services. Services may be paid for with public funding if the recipient is financially eligible. This includes minors, who usually are eligible if they have private or no insurance.

Call Hennepin County Front Door at 612-348-4111 to get information on where to get an assessment if you are a Hennepin County resident, or if Hennepin Health covers you. You may also get information on some of the programs located in Hennepin County, which perform assessments for other health plans.
