2026 Election Timeline

Midterm General Election

- September 18: Absentee voting begins for the general election
- October 13: General election deadline to pre-register to vote
- November 2: In-person absentee voting closes at 5 p.m.
- November 3: General Election Day (polls open 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.)

Voting absentee

Absentee voting begins September 18

Absentee voting begins September 18, leading up to the general election on November 3. Make sure you're prepared!

Register to vote

[September 15 is National Voter Registration Day](#)

Are you registered to vote? Now is a great time to do so if you plan to cast a ballot in the 2026 midterm election.

[Registering to vote is easy](#)

Minnesota makes it easy to check your voter registration status, register to vote, and update your registration at <https://www.sos.mn.gov/elections-voting/register-to-vote>.

Already registered? It's still a good idea to confirm your registration is correct and up to date. You will need to update your registration if you've moved or changed your name since the last time you voted. Pre-registration for the November 2026 election ends on October 13. If you plan to vote but miss this deadline, you can register at your polling place on Election Day by showing proof of residence. To register on Election Day at your polling place, provide proof of residence or have someone from your precinct vouch on your behalf.

Request an absentee ballot at <http://mnvotes.gov/absentee>. Your completed ballot must be received by Election Day, November 3.

Election Day reminders

Election Day is November 3

Voting early

- In-person – early voting ends November 2 at 5 p.m. [Find out where you can vote early in person](#).
- By mail – [absentee ballots](#) must arrive by Election Day, November 3 to be counted. Ballots may be hand delivered to your city elections office by 5:00 p.m. on election day.

Registering on Election Day

To register at your polling place, you'll need to bring proof of residence:

- ID with your current name and address; or
- Photo ID AND a document, like a utility bill, due or dated within 30 days of the election with your current residence; or
- Registered voter from the same precinct who can confirm your address.
