Sunset Drive reconstruction

County Road 51 in Spring Park

Project overview

Hennepin County and the City of Spring Park are working together to reconstruct Sunset Drive between Spring Street and Shadywood Road (County Road 19). The project team is currently working with the community to develop a design for the corridor that will best serve current and future users. Construction is anticipated to begin in 2023.

In 2021, the project team went out into the community, hosted a virtual open house, installed signage along key areas of the corridor, handed out flyers, and offered an online commenting map to hear from as many stakeholders as possible. This report summarizes all the feedback we received during this phase of engagement.

The project team will use the input gathered from the public and create different improvement options for the corridor. These improvements will be shared on the project website. The team will also continue to engage with the community safely in-person at local events throughout the year.
