What are Complete Streets?

Complete Streets help create livable communities by balancing the needs of all roadway users.

A Complete Streets approach integrates people and place in the planning, design, construction, operation and maintenance of a transportation network. This approach helps reduce transportation costs, while also improving safety, public health and equity.

One of the ways it addresses these issues is by including considerations for children, people living with disabilities, older adults, and people who cannot rely on a motor vehicle.

What does a Complete Street look like?

At Hennepin County, Complete Streets means designing roads that prioritize safety, mobility, accessibility and convenience for people of all ages and abilities — whether they are walking, rolling, biking, driving or using transit.

Hennepin County is a diverse area with different communities, environments, road types and other factors. Because of this, there is no singular design approach and streets will look different as a result, even when using a Complete Streets approach.

But to simplify things, a county road may include a combination of these elements:

- Sidewalks or trails
- Bike facilities
- Motor vehicle travel lanes
- Improved pedestrian crossings
- Parking near businesses and local destinations
- Landscaping, such as trees and streetlights
