

#### **Project status**

Hennepin County is currently in the process of developing detailed design plans for roadway and trail improvement for the second phase of work on Wayzata Boulevard (County Road 112). The limits of this work are from Wolf Pointe Trail to the Highway 12 ramps at Wayzata Boulevard. The final design is scheduled for completion in spring of 2017. Right of way and easements will be acquired in 2017 to allow construction to begin in 2018.


Project partners include the cities of Long Lake and Orono.

The first phase of this four mile corridor from Willow Drive to Wolf Pointe Trail is scheduled for construction to begin in 2017.

## Project background

County Road 112, Wayzata Boulevard, was originally constructed as part of the state's trunk highway system. In December 2008, the Minnesota Department of Transportation completed the Highway 12 bypass, and in 2011 returned jurisdiction of the now former Highway 12 to Hennepin County. As part of MnDOT's project, the roadway was overlain with bituminous to temporarily correct poor pavement surfaces. Other significant improvements of the corridor were not completed.

As a former trunk highway, the roadway was primarily designed for efficient traffic movement through the corridor. The current design does not adequately address many local priorities (such as pedestrian mobility and safety, as well as bicycle trail connectivity and access).







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


























**Wall Elevation View from CSAH 112**
