Volunteers must be able to pass a criminal background check, have a valid driver's license, and safely maintained and properly insured transportation, be able to be contacted by phone and email, be supportive and understanding of youth and families under duress, possess outstanding listening skills, and be comfortable working with diverse families/communities. An ability to speak a second language highly desirable. Commit to 10 plus hours a week for six months, Monday – Friday.

Juvenile Male Mentor

Overview

Mentors for Success (MFS) seeks committed male volunteers who can be a positive role model and support their male mentee in achieving academic success.
