



Disparity reduction in action – Connectivity

Broadband and Digital Inclusion

- Built more than 258 miles of fiber
- Served nearly 3,000 new households
- Leveraged \$873,000 in county funds to construct more than \$14 million in broadband infrastructure
- Provided digital navigation services to more than 6,000 clients





Growth in action – broadband and digital inclusion


Hennepin Connectivity Program

- Automatically enrolling Affordable Connectivity Program participants
- Utilizing 2024 as a pilot for broader strategies
- Aiming to enroll 25,800 households in 2024



Disparity reduction in action – Education

Education Support Services


- 1,400 students connected to services; 86% students of color
- Increased reading and math assessment scores and grades; school confidence improved significantly
- 97% of early readers increased their literacy skills



Growth in action – education services

- Providing an extensive array of services to individuals and families
- Championing literacy and academic skill development
- Leveraging cross-departmental partnerships
 - Credit recovery services
 - Individualized GED navigation and support
 - Expansion of literacy supports

Workforce development

- 403 Pathways graduates and 2,288 interns hired
- Avg wage \$21.50/hr.
- Expanded youth career programs
- Support of small to midsize businesses with talent retention




Growth in action – Employment


Disparity reduction in action – Health

Food insecurity

- Distributed nearly \$14 million in funds to address food insecurity
- Survey feedback resident needs and barriers to healthy, culturally appropriate foods
- Developed framework for a Food Security Partners Network




Percent of adults who reported often or sometimes worrying during the past 12 months that food in their household would run out before they had money to buy more



Disparity reduction in action – housing

Rental housing production and preservation

- 118% increase from 2019 →2023
- 41% of new rental units financed affordable <30% AMI

Creating homeownership opportunities

• 250% increase from 2019 → 2023

Housing people experiencing homelessness

• 57% increase from 2021 → 2023



Growth in action – housing strategies


\$191 million invested annually






Disparity reduction in action – Income


- Increase in BIPOC direct contract spending by almost 150%
- Growth in the number of contracting opportunities and responses to those opportunities
- Attraction of new vendors; ensures competitive and successful execution of contracts



Contract spending




BIPOC contract spend totals



Growth in action – Purchasing and Contract Services

- Advance strategies in growing partnerships with small, women and/or BIPOC owned businesses
- Joint disparity study
 - Growth in participating agencies to 13, up from 8
- Deepening strategies focused on providing technical assistance and creating transparency and outreach



Disparity reduction in action – Justice

Adult Representation Services

- +87% housing case support
- More than 7,500 total housing cases handled
- 6,300 of eviction cases handled concluded with positive results



Growth in action – Adult Representation Services


- Expand capacity to handle legal issues beyond evictions
 - Recent changes to landlord-tenant laws will have positive impact
- Strengthen partnerships across the county
 - Eviction expungement clinics in partnership with the Libraries
 - Providing legal rights information to residents at the Adult Corrections Facility






