Lyndale Avenue South

Dear neighbors,

Lyndale Avenue South between Lake Street and Franklin Avenue is a stretch long overdue for a safety overhaul that accounts for all those who walk, cycle, roll, take transit, or drive on Lyndale. Reconstruction needs to include intentional human-centered design that prioritizes safety, usability, car traffic calming, and the environment.

We convened as a community in December to discuss experience and immediate needs resulting in the installation of bollards — we're grateful to advocates and county public works for the prompt response; we know they aren't enough and were never the solution, but the action does represent the beginning of a much larger safety overhaul that will require time, planning, and dollars. I'm working diligently to bring these three factors together. Making Lyndale Avenue South a livable, usable, safe street will remain a top priority of mine until it is complete.

- Road and lane width
- Roadway striping
- Speed limit evaluation
- Enhanced facilities for individuals walking, rolling, cycling, and using transit
- Improved lighting
