Non-recurring Priorities and Strategies for 2020-2025

- Increase supply of targeted permanent supportive housing
- Increase supply of single-room occupancy housing
- Maximize mainstream support services, including Medicaid Housing Stabilization Services
- Seek reforms and alternatives to the Housing Support program
- Create pathways to training and employment



- Increase quantity, quality, and variety of deeply affordable supportive housing opportunities
 - Goal to increase the number of people in supportive housing programs
 - Tracking the number of new supportive housing opportunities
- One way to increase these opportunities is to fund the creation of new units
 - Long Term Homeless (LTH) Housing Support Program
 - Supportive Housing Strategy
 - Continuum of Care (CoC)

What is impacting the way we do this work?

- Increase in funding available for new developments
 - From the county and other capital funding partners
- Focus on incorporating the voice of people with lived experience of homelessness
 - Participation by people with lived experience in selection of new development funding and Housing Support providers
- Focus on equity
 - Culturally specific supportive service providers



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

Housing Support and Housing Stabilization Services (HSS) in Hennepin County

- Independent combination of Housing and Services
 - Service funding for locating and maintaining housing
 - Funding to cover rent, utilities, and housing related expenses
- 33 providers currently approved to provide both HS and HSS
 - Over \$7.1m of service funding so far this year



Choosing Diversity in Providers

- Request for Proposals focus on community needs and gaps
 - Culturally diverse/specific
 - Women/Minority owned
 - Population specific
- 9 providers chosen last year
 - 8 registered as HSS providers
 - 7 identify as one of the categories above





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
Assessing Disproportionality and Disparity





Assessing for Disparate Outcomes

- Longitudinal System Analysis
- Supports our understanding of how our homeless response system is serving households that belong to different race and ethnicity groups
- Includes performance measures LOT; RTH; exits to PD

Additional Efforts to Advance Equity



- Partnering with people with lived experience
- Ongoing monitoring of non-recurring area goals
- Collaborating with providers around continuous improvement efforts
- Prioritizing culturally specific providers for new funding opportunities
- Additional funding set aside for technical assistancecapacity building for new culturally specific providers
- Deeper analyses of service provision and outcomes for programs receiving funds



Highlighting Implemented Strategies for Rapid Rehousing

- Services that are client-driven and use a disparity reduction lens
- Reprioritizing RRH to focus services for Native Americans based on where we are seeing people in the homeless response system and the services they're eligible to receive
