The presentation introduced Artificial Intelligence (AI) and its growing relevance in the criminal justice system, focused on foundational concepts, generative AI, and implications for public safety.

Key points

- **AI Basics:** What AI is, how it differs from traditional technologies, and related ethical considerations.

- **Strategy:** Responsible adoption, with transparency, and human oversight.
- **Policy and Governance:** Emerging federal/state guidance, risk frameworks, and legislative trends.
- **Future Planning:** Governance, compliance, and long-term integration aligned with public trust and legal standards.

AI offers efficiency and effectiveness gains, but its use must be guided by ethics, legal compliance, and strong governance.

Committee Discussion & Highlights

Emphasized need for human oversight and review to address AI errors. Raised concerns about governance, accountability, and alignment with existing rules and legal expectations. Noted importance of data handling and security, including where AI processes and stores information. Discussed operational impacts, such as workload, staffing, and system-wide processes. Expressed interest in ongoing dialogue to support shared understanding and responsible decision-making.
